#### Holiday activities and food programme 2021

The Holiday activities and food programme is a government initiative that aims to provide healthy food and enriching activities during school holidays, primarily to children and young people aged 5 to 16 who are eligible for free school meals. It is funded by the Department for Education (DfE).

However, there are also a selection of activities and events that children who don't qualify for free school meals can enjoy too, as well as younger and older children in the family.

Many providers will have places available for children and young people not eligible for free school meals that you can pay for. Get in touch with them to find out if this is an option.

Our aim is for Oldham's children to socialise, learn and play during the summer holidays and have a great time doing it.

This year's programme includes:

- School holiday activities
- Healthy and nutritious meals for all children and young people attending
- A wide range of fun, physical and enriching activities
- Education around healthy eating and preparing food
- Information and advice for parents and carers
- A safe space for children to interreact with others

Mindful of our corporate responsibility to protect the most vulnerable, and given the increase in COVID numbers, a slow and cautious approach is wisest at this stage.

#### Moving forward therefore this is where as a Benefice we stand:

Track and trace no longer required.

No physical sharing of the peace

No sharing of communion wine

Sanitising as common practice

#### **Face masks**

Should be encouraged but cannot be enforced.

Queuing for Holy Communion can resume.

#### Social distancing

Should be encouraged but not rigidly enforced.

Chairs can be placed back in rows

Those who wish to sit with their friends, where all parties are happy with that, should be free to do so. People will largely self-regulate.


Singing of short hymns can resume quietly behind masks.

**Tea and coffee can resume.** Those who are anxious will absent themselves.

#### Weddings, funerals and baptisms

We cannot insist on social distancing or masks.

Those leading and assisting should take all necessary precautions.
