Could we do things a little differently this year to help our planet - Reduce, Reuse & Recycle


#### What about Christmas cards?

# The bells at St Chad's were ringing loud and clear last week.

Why are church bells ringing for COP26 this year? The Association of English Cathedrals is urging cathedrals across the nation to ring their bells on the eye of the COP26.

The Ring Out For Climate Change campaign is being led by Edward Gildea, a Christian Aid climate campaign organiser from Essex.

He is asking churches to ring their bells at 6pm for thirty minutes on Saturday, October 30 as a warning of the climate emergency and to mark the start of the conference.

He said: "We mostly associate church bells with the call to worship, weddings and very special national celebrations. But they also have another historic function: to ring out warnings.
